Dear Kennedy, Middle School Families,

We will be having student-led conferences on Monday October 28th from 11:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Your student's Employability Skills teacher will contact you to schedule a time for your conference, and we are aiming for 100% attendance.

What's the parent role during student led conferences? The adult's role is to ask probing questions that help students reflect upon their learning. We are trying to help students see improvements, next steps, or work habits that supported or impeded success.

I have never been part of a student-led conference. What are some good questions to ask during the student's presentation?

- What skills and knowledge did you learn this quarter?
- How did you improve your work over time?
- How did you use feedback to improve?
- What are you most proud of this quarter?
- If you were to do it over again, what would you do differently?
- What did the process teach you about your strengths and weaknesses in this class?
- What did you learn about yourself as a learner this quarter?

What if I have specific questions for one of my child's teachers? You will meet with your student's advisor. Should you have concerns that need to be addressed by a specific teacher, your crew leader will take notes and facilitate the connection.
